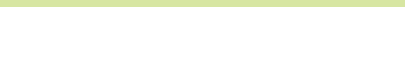

Women's Health Month

Did you know that 60% of the patients at CrossOver are women? Before coming to CrossOver many of these women have not received women's health services for years, if ever. Additionally, close to 20% of our patients are single mothers who are the sole care giver and financial providers for their families. Providing women's health services to this population is critical for not only the health of the mother, but the wellbeing of the entire family!

Three Key Factors of the CrossOver Women's Health Program

Well Woman Exams

Well woman exams are at the core of our women's health services. CrossOver is dedicated to providing an annual comprehensive women's health exam to all female patients, especially new patients. CrossOver has teamed with the Virginia Women's Center to provide volunteers for our regular women's health clinics.

Obstetrics (OB)

Our OB Program was created as part of the Healthy Homes campaign in 2004 in response to the demonstrated need for quality prenatal care among Richmond's uninsured, low-income women. Women enrolled in CrossOver's OB program receive comprehensive prenatal care, under the care of a clinical team.

Breast Health Initiative

Funded by Susan G. Komen for the Cure, this program focuses on breast screenings, treatment, and education, and seeks to improve access to breast health services for low-income, uninsured women. As part of this initiative, our volunteer Lay Health Promoters bring materials out to the general public to spread awareness beyond our patient base.
